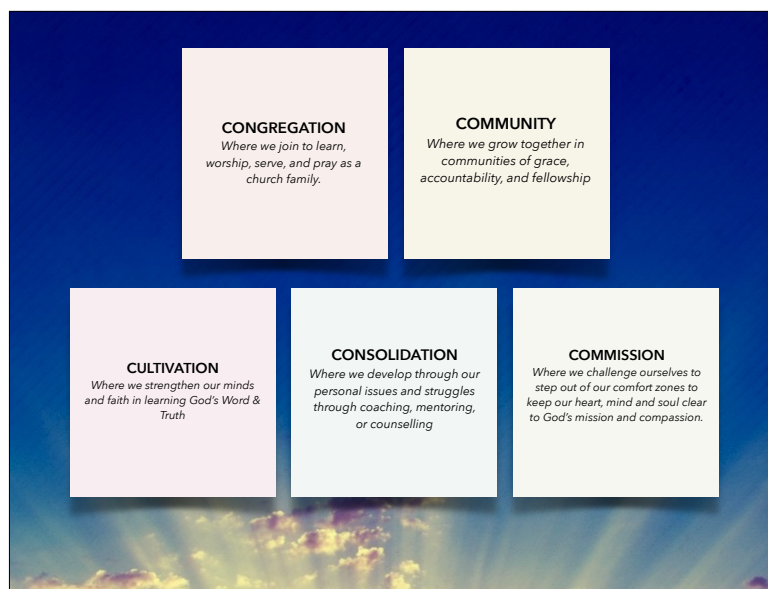

KEY THOUGHTS: Training mentors, counsellors, spiritual breakthrough; devising a way to support and implement

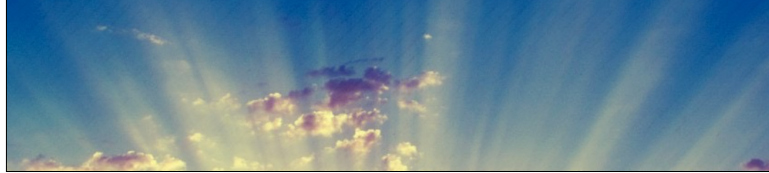
## COMMISSION

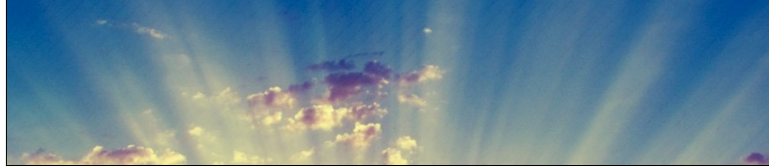

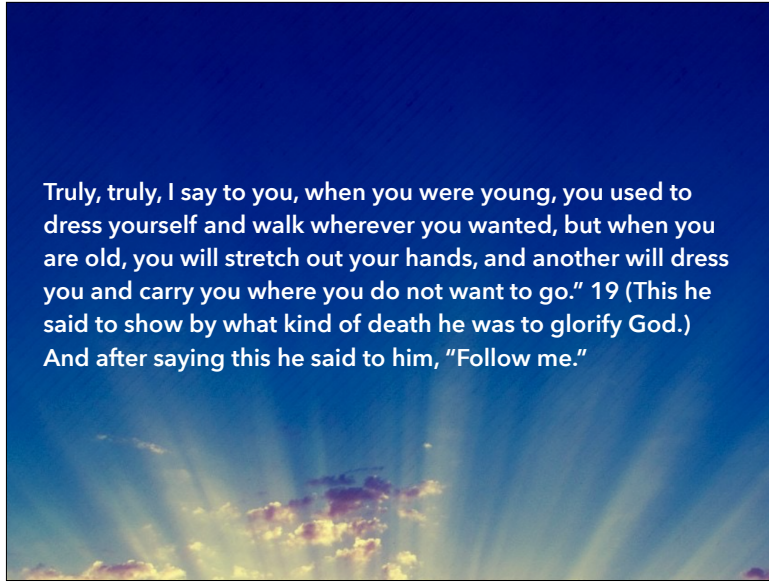
